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Healthcare Estates Exhibition Manchester



Colleagues from our FM, Property and **Business Services team recently attended** the Healthcare Estates Conference and Exhibition which was held at Manchester Central on the 8th and 9th of October.

Over two days the event brought together an exhibition of hundreds of suppliers from estates and facilities management, training, staffing, apprentices and fire and security. It also incorporated the Institute of Healthcare Engineering and Estates Management Conference.

The exhibition, conference and awards dinner attracted over 250 exhibitors from the healthcare estates arena and brought in thousands of visitors along with conference delegates. The event was divided up into zones and theatres including HVAC and Engineering, Infection Control and Water, Energy and Sustainability, Design and Construction, Facilities Management, Training, Staffing and Apprenticeships and Fire and Security. Our Senior Category Manager Jackie Williams and Category Manager Imran Ahmed from our FM, Property and

Business Services category spent two days meeting trusts and suppliers, highlighting what NOE CPC can offer and the different ways we can support both customers and suppliers working with us. They were supported by colleagues from the HR team who were on hand to talk about NOE CPC's Apprenticeships DPS and its benefits to trusts and other public sector organisations.

Jackie Williams delivered a presentation entitled 'Procurement and Estates in NHS: A collaborative opportunity' in the Facilities Management Theatre. The presentation highlighted the importance of collaboration within the NHS and how we are working to develop our engagement with both suppliers and trusts, how we manage challenges and working towards our goal of providing the best service for NHS trusts and service users. The session also touched on what we can offer in terms of sharing information. resources and experiences. Jackie also highlighted our successful collaborations with trusts on various frameworks including Laundry Solutions, Estates Consultancy and the Minor Works DPS.

The presentation generated a great deal of interest from both suppliers and trusts and we had a lot of gueries at the stand.

The exhibition was a great opportunity for NOE CPC to promote our extensive range of FM frameworks, as well as encourage interest from suppliers for our upcoming Soft and Hard FM frameworks.

The team had a very busy but productive two days at the event and speaking to trusts and suppliers gave us a real insight into the challenges faced both by NHS in how to deal with a £6.5billion maintenance backlog and repairing and replacing ageing buildings, and suppliers who want to know more about how they can contract with the health service.

Imran said: "The exhibition was a great success and we met with a lot of suppliers and trusts who were interested in what NOF CPC has to offer.

"Healthcare Estates was a great experience for NOE CPC and myself and my colleagues really enjoyed hearing from suppliers interested in contracting with the NHS and trusts interested in our framework offering. We were given some really interesting feedback about the challenges faced in facilities management and we will take this on board as we continue to move forward with our offering and estates strategy."

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Framework Launches



Technology (ICT)

Healthcare Performance Analytics and Benchmarking Systems

This framework enables trusts to undertake further competitions and/or direct award to compliant and capable framework suppliers for the purchase of healthcare informatics and benchmarking systems.

Further to the expiry of the previous NOE CPC Healthcare Informatics and Benchmarking Systems framework, a replacement agreement has been let to cover the following system functionalities and services required by NHS trusts:

- Performance dashboards
- Quality drill downs and mortality comparator
- Clinician outcomes and benchmarking for consultant revalidation and appraisal support
- International comparison
- Efficiency modules benchmarking costs
- Market share / referral module
- Other related software / data tools as may be offered by the suppliers.
- Considerable savings, potentially up to 50-65% for users of multimodules and/or full suite systems. The savings potential would be realised through competitive tendering and objective assessment / consideration of best value options
- Additional functionality for a similar or reduced spend for those trusts using fewer modules or a partial system
- Potential additional discounts as our leverage is utilised through volume banded commercial terms

- Compliant route to market with access to capable suppliers
- Use of the NHS Terms and Conditions for sourcing of these requirements, with the potential for the enhancement with the application of customised licensing terms.

Estates Consumable Products

This brand new multi-lot framework has been created to provide NHS trusts and other public sector organisations with a compliant route to market and access to a range of estates consumable products.

Careful consideration has been given to each Lot to ensure they meet our customer's requirements.

The framework covers building and construction products and additionally offers ironmongery including antiligature products, maintenance, repair and operating (MRO) items, abrasives, lubricants and adhesives, transmission (belts and bearings), plant hire and signage.

The basket of goods has been based on the spend of NHS Facilities departments and covers the estates consumables most used to keep hospitals and NHS buildings running.

Customers can order from an electronic catalogue for a next or same day delivery, or collection from a supplier, subject to product availability and order turnaround time.

The electronic catalogue offers reduced

transactional turnaround times and costs to both customers and suppliers. The further competition option provides potential cost savings or other value creating benefits.

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Purchases may be made on an account or via a purchasing card.

All products supplied under this framework meet industry, national and international quality standards. The Suppliers awarded to the framework also have in place quality assurance systems to cover their supply chain. A minimum warranty period of 12 months is provided on all goods.

The framework has been structured to encourage the use of small and medium sized enterprises (SME's) and micro enterprises, many of them local to the member organisations.

This framework has been divided into 10 Lots:

- Lot 1 Tools
- Lot 2 Building Supplies
- Lot 3 Plumbing & heating supplies
- Lot 4 Electrical supplies: general products, cable, lighting & distribution
- Lot 5 Timber & joinery
- Lot 6 Paints & solvents
- Lot 7A Ironmongery: general products, hangers & brackets
- Lot 7B Ironmongery: door furniture
- Lot 7C Ironmongery: locks & keys
- Lot 7D Ironmongery: screws & fasteners
- Lot 8A Mechanical and industrial consumables general products, abrasives, lubricants and adhesives
- Lot 8B Mechanical and industrial consumables – drive belts & bearings
- Lot 9 Plant hire
- Lot 10 Signage (NHS)

You will learn what an apprenticeship is, different types of apprenticeships and their cost, and how they are core to the NHS Long Term Plan and People Strategy.
